



Lodgers Tax Collected






Lodgers Tax Monthly Revenue












Mountain destinations elevate the group experience

"The hills are alive with the sound of music," sang Julie Andrews many years ago, and indeed they still are.

Music plus other wonderful arts experiences, including handson classes, group-friendly museums and annual festivals, fill the West's mountain towns from Vail, Colo., to Jackson Hole, Wo., to Sun Valley, Idaho.

Read on for an impressive lineup of cultural ideas to consider when bringing a group to one of the following popular mountain retreats.

Taos

"Taos shines year-round as a mecca for arts and culture, but fall is undoubtedly the peak of all of the fun," said Karina Armijo, director of marketing and tourism for the Town of Taos.

Autumn is such a happening time here in large part because of the Taos Fall Arts Festival, one of the city's oldest traditions.

The week-long event offers various types of art, a film festival, hands-on workshops and a new addition called The Paseo, which highlights installation, performance and projection art.

"With plenty of fun and interactive pieces, this makes for an excellent group excursion," Armijo said.

When groups are out and about visiting the Taos Plaza, they should also veer off and explore the historic adobelined Ledoux Street.

"Ledoux Street is a must," Armijo said. "This narrow winding road is sprinkled with local art galleries and shops and makes for an excellent walk for groups that want to experience the true authenticity that Taos has to offer."

Stops along the way should include 203 Fine Art, an art gallery, the Blumenschein House, a National Historic Landmark, and the Harwood Museum of Art, which offers group tours and programming for adults, including art classes and concerts with the Taos Chamber Music Group.

"A day spent walking through the plaza and down Ledoux Street leaves plenty to talk about over dinner at any of the amazing local restaurants in the area," Armijo said.









Ed Moses has been around the block. The abstract painter who rose to prominence partly "for his association with the 'Cool School,' a group of artists that also includes Taos residents Larry Bell and the late Ken Price, known for their rebellious behavior and reputations as partiers and playboys" is the focus right now of some well-deserved attention by several prominent art institutions.

In Taos, where he visited and worked from time to time, Moses is being celebrated in an exhibition featuring nine of his mixed media drawings and paintings at 203 Fine Art. The venue, which hosted an opening reception Friday (Aug. 12), is located at 203 Ledoux St., a block southwest of Taos Plaza.

Gallery owner Eric Andrews told Tempo that Bell encouraged him to invite Moses to the opening, but the artist, at 90 years old, is not well enough to travel from his home in Venice Beach, California. Still, there is no doubt that his presence will be felt among his many local admirers.

In the press release referenced in the lead to this article, Moses has been shaping the West Coast art scene for more than 50 years. The works that 203 Fine Art will have on view date from the 1980s and 1990s.






